An act to lay off and erect a new county, in the north-west part of the Territory of Arkansas, to be called and known by the name of Washington.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Territory of Arkansas*, That all that portion of country bounded and described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point where the western boundary line of the territory strikes the northern boundary line of town twelve north; thence east with the northern boundary line of town twelve north to the western boundary line of range twenty-five west; thence north with said line to the southern boundary line of the state of Missouri; thence west with said boundary line to the south-west corner of the state of Missouri; thence south with the western boundary line of the territory of Arkansas to the beginning, be constituted and erected into a new county, to be called and known by the name of Washington; and henceforth the county of Loveley shall be extinguished.

Privileges.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That, from and after the taking effect of this act, the county hereby established shall be vested with all the privileges, powers, and immunities, of a separate and distinct county.

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Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this act shall take effect, and be in force, from and after the first day of November next.

An act supplementary to the several laws for the collection of small debts.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Territory of Arkansas*, That the first section of an act, entitled "an act in amendment to the act relative to writs of certiorari," approved the second day of November, 1825, be, and the same is hereby, revived, re-enacted, and declared to be in full force, in this territory, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
