

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

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AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF A ONE-FOURTH OF ONE PERCENT (0.25%) SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN **OTHER MATTERS**

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WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS; AND PRESCRIBING PERTAINING THERETO. WHEREAS, the Quorum Court of Washington County,

expand, equip, furnish, operate and maintain new or existing jail and law enforcement facilities including any necessary utility, road, storage building, court and parking improvements related thereto or in support thereof; and WHEREAS, Title 26, Chapter 74, Subchapter 2 of the

Arkansas (the "County") has determined that there is a great need for an additional source

of revenue to be used for one or more of the following: to acquire, construct, improve,

Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated (the "Authorizing Legislation") provides for the levy of county-wide sales and use taxes at the rate of 0.125%, 0.25%, 0.5%, 0.75% or 1%, or any combination thereof; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to levy a new county-wide sales and use tax at the rate of 0.25%, the net collections of which will be distributed only to the County and used for the purposes described above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM **COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:**

ARTICLE 1. Under the authority of the Authorizing Legislation, there is hereby levied a 0.25% tax on the gross receipts from the sale at retail within the County of all items which are subject to the Arkansas Gross Receipts Act of 1941, as amended (A.C.A. §§26-52-101, et seq.), and the imposition of an excise (or use) tax on the storage, use, distribution or other consumption within the County of tangible

THE COUNTY WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS,

AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

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AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS ON THE OF ISSUING QUESTIONS BONDS AMENDMENT NO. 62 TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING ALL OR A PORTION OF THE COST OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS: LEVYING A NEW ONE-HALF OF ONE PERCENT (0.5%) SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF RETIRING SUCH BONDS: AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS

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WHEREAS, the Quorum Court of Washington County, Arkansas (the "County") has determined that the County is greatly in need of additional jail and law enforcement facilities, including particularly, without limitation, an expansion and improvement of the existing County jail facility and any necessary utility, road, storage building, court and parking improvements related thereto or in support thereof (collectively, the "Jail Improvements"); and

PERTAINING THERETO.

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court of the County has further determined that the County is greatly in need of public safety communication system facilities and apparatus and any necessary land, utility and road improvements related thereto or in support thereof (the "Public Safety Communication Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the County can finance all or a portion of the costs of the Improvements by the issuance of capital improvement bonds (the "Bonds") in one or more series under the authority of Amendment No. 62 to the Constitution of the State of Arkansas ("Amendment 62") and Title 14, Chapter 164, Subchapter 3 of the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated (the "Authorizing Legislation") allocated as follows: \$38,000,000 in maximum principal amount for the Jail Improvements; and \$11,000,000 in maximum principal amount for the Public Safety Communication Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Authorizing Legislation provides for the levy

of one or more county-wide sales and use taxes at the rate of 0.125%, 0.25%, 0.5%, 0.75% or 1% or any combination thereof, but not to exceed 1% in the aggregate; and

WHEREAS, the County does not currently have a sales and use tax levied under the authority of the Authorizing Legislation; and

WHEREAS, the County can pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds from the proceeds of a new county-wide one-half of one percent (0.5%) sales and use tax to be levied under the authority of the Authorizing Legislation solely for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to levy a sales and use tax at the rate of one-half of one percent (0.5%) on the receipts from the sales at retail within the County of all items which are subject to taxation under the Arkansas Gross Receipts Act of 1941, as amended (A.C.A. §§26-52-101, et seq.), and the receipts from storing, using, distributing or consuming within the County tangible personal property under the Arkansas Compensating Tax Act of 1949, as amended (A.C.A. §§26-53-101, et seq.) (collectively, the "Sales and Use Tax") and to submit to the electors of the County the questions of issuing the Bonds under Amendment 62 and the Authorizing Legislation at a special election to be called for that purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

ARTICLE 1. Under the authority of the Authorizing Legislation, there is hereby levied the Sales and Use Tax. The Sales and Use Tax shall be levied, and the net collections received after deduction of the administrative charges of the State of Arkansas and required rebates shall be used solely for the purpose of retiring or paying obligations with respect to the Bonds. The Sales and Use Tax shall be levied and collected on the gross receipts, gross proceeds or sales price in the maximum amount allowed from time to time under Arkansas law, subject to rebates and limitations as from time to time required by Arkansas statutes for certain single transactions. The levy of the Sales and Use Tax shall not take effect unless the issuance of the Bonds for one or both of the purposes is approved by the voters as provided herein.

ARTICLE 2. There is hereby called a special election to be held on March 12, 2019, at which election there shall be submitted to the electors of the County, the questions of issuing the Bonds in one or more series under Amendment 62 and the Authorizing Legislation in the maximum principal amounts set forth above to be payable, in whole or in part, from the net collections of the Sales and Use Tax.

ARTICLE 3. The questions of issuing the Bonds shall be placed on the ballot for the election in substantially the following form:

The bonds described below that are approved may be combined into a

single issue or may be issued in series from time to time. If the bonds for 81 one or both of the purposes are approved, there will be levied 0.5% sales 82 and use tax, the net collections of which remaining after the State of 83 Arkansas deducts its administrative charges, will be used solely to retire the 84 bonds and obligations of the County with respect thereto.
