

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE DAILY FEE CHARGED TO MUNICIPALITIES FOR HOUSING PRISONERS IN THE COUNTY JAIL.

WHEREAS, A.C.A. §12-41-506 allows Quorum Courts to establish a daily fee to be charged to municipalities for keeping prisoners of municipalities in the county jail; and,

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Supreme Court, in *Mississippi County, Arkansas v. City of Blytheville, Arkansas*, 2018 Ark. 50, defined prisoners of municipalities as those offenders who are arrested by municipal law enforcement officers and delivered to the County jail for incarceration, from the point of intake until (a) charging on a felony offense, (b) sentencing on a misdemeanor offense, and (c) release on a municipal-ordinance violation; and,

WHEREAS, the Washington County Quorum Court desires to establish a daily fee to house municipal prisoners at the county jail; and,

WHEREAS, the Washington County Quorum Court encourages the Washington County Judge to enter into contracts with the municipalities to establish the amount charged for keeping of municipal prisoners at the Washington County Detention Center; and,

WHEREAS, any municipality that enters into a contract with Washington County that establishes an amount to be charged for keeping municipal prisoners at the Washington County Detention Center shall not pay the daily fee established by this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM

41 **COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:**

43 **ARTICLE 1.** Each municipality that has not entered into a
44 contract with Washington County for keeping municipal prisoners at the Washington
45 County Detention Center shall pay a daily fee of \$76.57 per prisoner housed in the
46 Washington County Detention Center beginning January 1, 2020.

47
48 **ARTICLE 2.** Prisoners of municipalities are defined as those
49 offenders who are arrested by municipal law enforcement officers and delivered to the
50 County Jail for incarceration, from the point of intake until (a) charging on a felony offense,
51 (b) sentencing on a misdemeanor offense, and (c) release on a municipal ordinance
52 violation.

53
54 **ARTICLE 3.** A penalty of \$25.00 shall be assessed to any
55 municipality for its failure to submit the prisoner fees to the Washington County Sheriff
56 within 45 days after a request for payment is made to the municipality or other
57 governmental agency by the Sheriff. Each day of noncompliance shall be considered a
58 separate violation.

60 **ARTICLE 4.** Any municipality that has entered into a contract
61 with Washington County that establishes the amount charged for the housing of its
62 prisoners shall not be subject to the daily fee imposed by this ordinance.
