# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY QUORUM COURT

Thursday, July 18, 2019 6:00 p.m. Washington County Quorum Court Room

County Judge Joseph K. Wood called the meeting to order.

JP Deakins led the prayer and pledge.

Members present were JP Lance Johnson, JP Susan Cunningham, JP Harvey Bowman, JP Judith Yanez, JP Patrick Deakins, JP Lisa Ecke, JP Sam Duncan, JP Shawndra Washington, JP Eva Madison, JP Andrea Jenkins, JP Sue Madison, JP Willie Leming, JP Ann Harbison, and JP Butch Pond. JP Suki Highers was absent.

A request to add a resolution to be part of the Judge's Report was made by JP Johnson. A request to add a resolution for a grant was made by JP Harbison. There was a comment made by JP E Madison. A motion to adopt the agenda as amended was made by JP S Madison and seconded by JP Leming. A voice vote was called and majority of the members present voted to adopt the agenda as amended. JP E Madison opposed.

A motion to suspend the rules and read all ordinances and resolutions by title only was made by JP S Madison and seconded by JP Leming. A voice vote was called and all members present unanimously voted to approve the motion.

JP Bowman gave an update on the County Services Committee – The Committee did not meet due to lack of an agenda.

JP Harbison gave an update on the Finance & Budget Committee – Reports were given by Treasurer Bobby Hill, Risk Management Consultant Nelson Driver, and Comptroller Shannon Worthen. Three ordinances were approved to be added to the Quorum Court Consent Agenda. There was discussion on an ordinance appropriating money for a bond counsel for Johnson Controls. The ordinance was postponed until the next meeting. There was discussion on an ordinance for the ombudsman's proposal. It was approved to move the ordinance to the Quorum Court. There was discussion on the budget process.

JP Pond gave an update on the Personnel Committee – The Committee did not meet due to lack of an agenda.

JP Johnson presented the August Jails/Law Enforcement/Courts Committee Report. During the August meeting there were statistic reports given on the Juvenile Detention Center, Sheriff's Enforcement, Detention, and Pre-Trial vs Bed Count. The Committee requested the County Attorney to draft an ordinance accepting the ombudsman's proposal. There was a review of the 2019 Jail Budget. There was discussion on an ordinance to establish the daily fee to municipalities for housing prisoners in the county jail. The ordinance was not approved.

A request to receive an update on the Crisis Stabilization Unit was made by JP S Madison. Judge Joseph Wood gave the update.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.

City of Blytheville, Arkansas, 2018 Ark. 50, defined prisoners of 20 municipalities as those offenders who are arrested by municipal law enforcement officers 21 and delivered to the County jail for incarceration, from the point of intake until (a) charging 22 on a felony offense, (b) sentencing on a misdemeanor offense, and (c) release on a 23 municipal-ordinance violation; and, 24 25 WHEREAS, the Washington County Quorum Court desires to 26 establish a daily fee to house municipal prisoners at the county jail; and, 27 28 WHEREAS, the Washington County Quorum 29 encourages the Washington County Judge to enter into contracts with the municipalities 30 to establish the amount charged for keeping of municipal prisoners at the Washington 31 County Detention Center; and, 32 33 WHEREAS, any municipality that enters into a contract with 34 Washington County that establishes an amount to be charged for keeping municipal 35 prisoners at the Washington County Detention Center shall not pay the daily fee 36 established by this ordinance. 37
