MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY QUORUM COURT

Thursday, August 15, 2019 6:00 p.m. Washington County Quorum Court Room

County Judge Joseph K. Wood called the meeting to order.

JP Duncan led the prayer and pledge.

Members present were JP Lance Johnson, JP Susan Cunningham, JP Harvey Bowman, JP Judith Yanez, JP Patrick Deakins, JP Lisa Ecke, JP Sam Duncan, JP Eva Madison, JP Andrea Jenkins, JP Suki Highers, JP Sue Madison, JP Willie Leming, JP Ann Harbison, and JP Butch Pond. JP Shawndra Washington was absent.

A motion to adopt the agenda was made by JP S Madison and seconded by JP Leming. A voice vote was called and all members present unanimously voted to adopt the agenda.

A motion to suspend the rules and read all ordinances by title only was made by JP S Madison and seconded by JP Pond. A voice vote was called and all members present unanimously voted to approve the motion.

During citizen comments, Dan Marzoni, Lynn Marzoni, and Wendy Boswell shared their concerns about the paving of Trace Branch Road. Frank Mayfield spoke about the Jail Study.

A motion to approve the July 18th minutes was made by JP S Madison and seconded by JP Harbison. A voice vote was called and all members present unanimously voted to approve the minutes.

Judge Joseph Wood presented his Judge's Report. Judge Wood presented to the Court a Purchasing Department Report of the Disposal of County Property for July. He also gave an update on the Northwest Arkansas Crisis Stabilization Unit. The first NWA CSU Report was submitted to DHS by Ozark Guidance. There was a comment made by JP S Madison.

Judge Joseph Wood introduced items on the consent agenda. County Attorney Brian Lester read each ordinance by title only, Item 8.1 "AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE TITLE OF MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN II TO MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN/LEAD TRAINER IN THE BUILDINGS & GROUNDS BUDGET FOR 2019; AND, APPROPRIATING \$1,171 TO THE BUILDINGS & GROUNDS BUDGET FOR 2019". In Article 2 a line item was left off. The total appropriation amount was correct but line item 3094 (meals and lodging) for \$1000 will need to be added. A motion to adopt all the ordinances on the consent agenda to include the amendment on item 8.6 was made by JP E Madison and seconded by JP Pond. There were no public comments. A roll call vote was called and all members present unanimously voted to adopt the ordinances.

JP Bowman presented the August County Services Committee Report. During the August meeting there was discussion on the Quorum Court audio upgrade.

JP Harbison presented the August Finance & Budget Committee Report. During the August meeting there were reports given by Treasurer Bobby Hill, Risk Management Consultant Nelson Driver, and Comptroller Shannon Worthen. There was discussion on an ordinance appropriating money for a bond counsel for Johnson Controls. Joel Gardner, Executive Director of Ozark Regional Transit presented the Committee a job study showing the need of an increase for their drivers' hourly wages. There were six ordinances approved to be added to the Quorum Court Consent Agenda. Chief Gales gave an update on the Quorum Court audio upgrade. There was discussion on the upcoming budget meetings.

JP Johnson presented the August Jails/Law Enforcement/Courts Committee Report. During the August meeting there were Statistic Reports given on the Juvenile Detention Center, Sheriff's Enforcement, Detention, and Pre-Trial vs Bed Count. Judge Stacey Zimmerman gave an update on Juvenile Court. Sheriff Tim Helder provided information on modular jail units. There was discussion on an ordinance to establish the daily fee charged to municipalities for housing prisoners in the county jail. There was discussion on a resolution encouraging all criminal justice agencies throughout Washington County to adopt the principle that no person should be detained in the Washington County Detention Center awaiting trial solely because of their inability to obtain pretrial release through traditional bail/bond.

JP Pond presented the August Personnel Committee Report. During the August meeting the Committee approved two requests from Circuit Clerk Kyle Sylvester to adjust the pay on two positions. The Committee also approved to forward two requests from County Judge Joseph Wood to the Finance & Budget Committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:02 p.m.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE DAILY FEE CHARGED TO MUNICIPALITIES FOR HOUSING PRISONERS IN THE COUNTY JAIL.

WHEREAS, A.C.A. §12-41-506 allows Quorum Courts to establish a daily fee to be charged to municipalities for keeping prisoners of municipalities in the county jail; and,

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Supreme Court, in *Mississippi County, Arkansas v. City of Blytheville, Arkansas*, 2018 Ark. 50, defined prisoners of municipalities as those offenders who are arrested by municipal law enforcement officers and delivered to the County jail for incarceration, from the point of intake until (a) charging on a felony offense, (b) sentencing on a misdemeanor offense, and (c) release on a municipal-ordinance violation; and,

WHEREAS, the Washington County Quorum Court desires to establish a daily fee to house municipal prisoners at the county jail; and,

WHEREAS, the Washington County Quorum Court encourages the Washington County Judge to enter into contracts with the municipalities to establish the amount charged for keeping of municipal prisoners at the Washington County Detention Center; and,

WHEREAS, any municipality that enters into a contract with Washington County that establishes an amount to be charged for keeping municipal prisoners at the Washington County Detention Center shall not pay the daily fee established by this ordinance.

Re: Request for \$81,667 in Insurance Proceeds to be appropriated to the Sheriff's Budget, \$25,270 in anticipated Insurance Proceeds to the Jail Maintenance budget, and a Line Item Transfer in the Communication Facility/Equipment fund budget

We have submitted two ordinances for consideration at the September 10, 2019 Finance Committee meeting. Following is some explanation for those ordinances. We are also asking for a Line Item Transfer in the Communications Facility/Equipment Fund budget and there is additional explanation about that in this memorandum.

We have had three vehicles in the Sheriff's Budget (1000-0400) totaled this year in wrecks and insurance has paid the County a total of \$ 81,667 for the losses. The last of the proceeds (\$ 67,430.86) was recently received and deposited in the General Fund in August.

We are requesting to have \$81,667 appropriated and the Sheriff budget adjusted to add \$77,667 to Vehicle line item 1000-0400-4005 so we can buy replacement vehicles and \$4,000 to Computer/IT Equipment line item 1000-0400-2009 to cover the cost of the damaged mobile computer and mount for one of the vehicles.

We were fortunate and recently found a replacement state bid police Tahoe and purchased it out of our 2019 Vehicle capital account. But now we don't have the required funds to buy the Criminal investigation vehicle we were originally going to buy this year and we still have to find a replacement truck for the Fire Marshal. If we have enough funds, we also hope to replace another 2004 vehicle with over 170,000 miles that is having mechanical problems and is assigned to the Enforcement Major. We plan to buy used vehicles unless the State bid has any suitable vehicles for less that can actually be delivered.

We also had a maintenance pickup totaled (Jail Operations and Maintenance budget) and insurance has notified us a check is forthcoming any day in the amount of \$25,270 and it will be deposited to the Jail Fund. We wish to appropriate the \$25,270 in anticipated revenue from the Jail Fund to the Jail Operations & Maintenance Budget (30170127-4005) for 2019 so a replacement vehicle can be purchased.

Our third request on this agenda is a Line Item Transfer in the 2019 Communications Facility/Equipment Fund budget.

We budgeted \$ 65,128 in the 2019 Communications Facility/Equipment Fund budget to procure two VESTA 911 Workstations for our 911 Communications Center. As the project has

progressed we found the funds need to be transferred to a different line item in the budget. Because of Budget Control rules we are required to have Quorum Court approval to transfer the money.

We wish to decrease Line Item 30140400-4009 (Computer Machinery/Equipment) by \$65,128.00 and Increase Line item 30140400-3073 (Lease-Machinery and Equipment) by \$65,128.00.
