The number of classroom grants awarded will depend on the total number of applicants. Grants are available for up to \$500. Classroom grants can be used for a variety of projects and materials, including but not limited to software, calculators, math manipulatives, art supplies, audio-visual equipment, and lab materials. Classroom grants are available to all educators in Arkansas. Awards are competitive. ASTA members receive additional weight in the scoring rubric. ASTA requests that scholarship and grant winners wait three complete grant cycles before applying again for an ASTA or Teacher Scholarship Classroom Grant.
