Meeting called to order at 2:15 pm by Chairman Oelschlaeger.

Actions taken by the Commissioners during the August 13, 2020 public meeting:

- Approved Minutes of July 15, 2020
- Springdale Special Election Provisional Ballot review
- Reviewed 2021 Budget

### City of Springdale Special Election

Provisional Ballot review: 2 Absentee ballots were not able to be counted because one was missing an address and the second one was signed by the POA for the voter.

2 Election Day provisional ballots were not able to be counted because the voters were registered to vote in Benton County.

2 Election Day provisional ballots were eligible to be counted, because voter's absentee ballots had not been returned to the County Clerk's office.

2021 Budget was reviewed by Commissioners. The Budget reflected an odd year budget which was similar to budgets from 2017 and 2019.

2020 Budget – Jennifer was concerned about the potential Run-Off elections for the City of Fayetteville and City of Springdale. The Commission may have to seek cost for poll workers for those elections, but that cost would be paid back to the County by the cities holding the Run-Off.

Absentee Ballot Canvas – for the General Election will have 12 teams of 2 people each team. This will also add to the cost of payroll, since only 4 days of canvassing with a smaller crew was scheduled. This cost may be eligible to be reimbursed by the CARES Act.

Received Covid-19 supplies from the state on 8/12. Staff will inventory the supplies and then determine what else would be needed for the General Election.

Early vote locations – Discussed what we would do if early vote site had to close because Of Covid-19. Emergency Clause should allow for naming a replacement site.  
We are looking at locations we already use to see if they have a larger facility  
Next to building currently used.

Election Day locations – 19 locations have been identified that would be required to be open. Lack of poll workers and size of some locations will be a factor in temporarily closing a location.

Run-Off election will be 3 in Fayetteville and one in Springdale. Absentee Ballots for Run-offs in Springdale and Fayetteville will be sent out 11/20. Run off is December 1<sup>st</sup>. The Run-Off election



will have a tight schedule due to the Thanksgiving Holiday during Early Vote.

Next meeting is 8/21 at 1pm in the Quorum Court Room for the ballot draw.

With no other business the meeting was adjourned at 3:28 pm.
