

### **Detainee Classification**

Classification is the separation of detainees who cannot be housed together by law. This reduces the functional capacity of our jail because we cannot utilize every bed, due to separation.

Historically, we separated detainees by: males and females, adults and juveniles, misdemeanors and felons, and sentenced and unsentenced. This allowed detainees charged with minor level felonies to be housed with high level felonies (e.g. hot check arrestee housed with capital murder suspect). Around 2014 we were looking for a way to better utilize our housing space. We looked to the National Institute of Corrections (<a href="https://nicic.gov">https://nicic.gov</a>) for guidance in housing detainees based on an objective classification system. In 2015, we implemented objective classification at the Washington County Detention Center.

With objective classification, we are still required to separate males from females and adults from juveniles. Additionally, detainees are categorized as minimum, medium, or maximum. This custody level is determined by: severity of current offense/conviction; serious offense history; escape history; institutional disciplinary history; prior felony convictions; alcohol/drug abuse; and stability factors (e.g., age, employment, length of residence). Detainees can be housed with other detainees whose custody level is no more than one level away from their own (e.g. a minimum will not be housed with a maximum). Objective classification results in fewer categories and therefore fewer empty beds due to separation.

Detainees receive their Initial Custody Assessment within 48 hours of booking, excluding weekends and holidays. A Custody Reassessment will be conducted within 30 days of the Initial Custody Assessment and immediately upon any disciplinary action and/or change in legal status. All minimum classifications will have a reassessment conducted every 90 days thereafter. All medium and maximum classifications will have a reassessment conducted every 30 days thereafter.

Some additional factors that reduce the functional capacity of our facility are:

- Administrative Segregation housed separately for a behavioral, safety or security concern.
- Disciplinary Segregation housed separately for being found guilty of a rule violation.
- Medical housed separately for a medical need.
- Workers detainees that perform food service and janitorial duties for the facility.
- Sexual Offense detainees charged with a sexual related offense.
