15	WHEREAS, on April 16, 2020, the Arkansas Senate and		
16 17	House of Representatives passed HB 1082 (Act 2 of 2020), amending Ark. Code Ann. §		
18	25-19-106, and allowing the Washington County Quorum Court and other public entities		
19	to assemble, gather, meet, and conduct open public meetings through electronic means;		
20	and,		
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22	WHEREAS, the ability for the Quorum Court and its		
23	subcommittees to conduct virtual meetings as described in the above legislation expired		
24	when the Governor's Emergency Order 21-07 expired on May 30, 2021; and,		
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26	WHEREAS, even though the Washington County Quorum		
27	Court and its members are now required to meet in person, there is nothing in Arkansas law or Washington County Ordinance that prohibits the Court from conducting hybrid		
28 29	meetings that allow the public to participate in its meetings electronically; and,		
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31	WHEREAS, the community has been participating in		
32	meetings virtually since early last year due to the Covid-19 Pandemic for safety and other		
33	reasons, and Washington County purchased equipment and infrastructure necessary to		
34	allow such virtual participation by the community; and,		
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36	WHEREAS, as a public service to the community, the		
37	Washington County Quorum Court desires that its public meetings and those of its		
38	subcommittees provide for remote participation by the public in conjunction with an in-		
39 40	person meeting, which shall be referred to herein as a "hybrid meeting"; and,		
40 41	WHEREAS, this remote participation shall include the		
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opportunity for the community to offer public comment and address the court, and
otherwise generally permitted interactions at such meetings as set out in Washington
County Code; and,

WHEREAS, all hybrid meetings shall be held as closely
consistent with the applicable statutes, special acts, county ordinances, resolutions or
procedures as possible, and in compliance with the open meetings provisions set forth in
the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act, while still allowing for electronic participation
by the community members.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

<u>ARTICLE 1.</u> That whenever possible, except for times when
there are technical difficulties or equipment failure, all open meetings of the Washington
County Quorum Court and its subcommittees shall be conducted as "hybrid meetings"
that simultaneously provide for remote participation by members of the community.

60 <u>ARTICLE 2.</u> These "hybrid meetings" shall be held as closely 61 consistent with the applicable statutes, special acts, county ordinances, resolutions or 62 procedures as possible, and in compliance with the open meetings provisions set forth in 63 the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act, while still allowing for electronic participation 64 by community members, including the opportunity for the community to offer public 65 comment if otherwise generally permitted at such meetings as set out in Washington 66 County Code.

68 <u>ARTICLE 3.</u> If there are ordinances or parts of ordinance in 69 conflict with any parts of this ordinance, then this ordinance shall prevail.

ARTICLE 4. This ordinance being necessary for the public
peace, health, and safety shall be in full effect immediately upon adoption and signing.
