<u>Ministry</u>

We have non-denominational services & fellowship every Sunday. If you would like your pastor to visit your son/daughter you will need to contact the JDC staff to make arrangements.

<u>School</u>

All youth must attend school unless they have graduated or have their GED. Students work primarily in the areas of reading, language, science, and math to strengthen their skills. If you have any questions, you may contact the classroom at (479) 444-1670 ext. 5.

"Be Proud, Be Responsible" HIV Prevention

A group session is held weekly to increase knowledge about transmission and prevention of HIV infection.

FINS - "Fishing In the Natural State"

This is a youth fishing education program that uses best management practices, public/private partnerships, and quality educational materials, to effectively recruit anglers from all sectors of society who become responsible stewards of aquatic resources.

<u>Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program for High</u> <u>Risk Youth.</u>

Through the Office of Coordinated School Health, this is an effort to provide training and resources to assist in teen pregnancy prevention for incarcerated youth.

We have several community groups that donate their time & service such as the Arkansas Workforce, the Rape Crisis Center, and The AR Game & Fish Association , Into the Light, and a licensed cosmetologist.

Youth <u>will receive</u> a handbook that will explain the rules, regulations and behavioral expectations during their stay in detention.

If you need to contact your son/daughter's Probation, FINS, or Intake Officer, please call (479) 444-1739.

<u>Visitation</u>: Appointments must be made Monday – Friday, 8:00am – 5:00 pm

- 1. Only parents or legal guardians are permitted to visit. (Residents may complete a "Visitors Request Form" for extended family to visit. The visit may or may not be approved.)
- 2. Parents/Guardians are allowed one 30 minute visit within the first 24 hours of intake. You will be asked to fill out a parent packet at this time.
- 3. Visitation hours are
 - **Saturday Pre-Adjudicated** 9:00 am – 10:30 am 2:00 pm – 3:30 pm **Sunday – Sentenced & FINS** 9:00 am – 10:30 am 2:00 pm – 3:30 pm
- 4. Visitation is for 30 min.
- 5. Youth shall have the option of receiving visitors.
- 6. Picture ID & car keys are the only personal effects permitted into the facility. All other items should be left in your vehicle.
- 7. Picture identification of visitors will be requested and is required.
- 8. Visitors must adhere to all rules regarding visitation.
- 9. Visitation is monitored by direct supervision.
- 10. Visitors are subject to search and/or denial of admission if:
 - a) There is prior information of a security risk involving a visitor.
 - b) The visitor has been involved in passing contraband on a prior occasion. Contraband is to be considered any item that has not been pre-authorized by detention staff.
 - c) The visitor is suspected of using alcohol or illicit drugs prior to visit.
- 11. Special visits may be arranged in the following circumstances:
 - a) Family members traveling more than one hour.

- b) Health limitations of the youth or family member.
- c) Work schedule of family members
- d) Family emergency situations such as a death or sudden illness.
- 12. You and your son/daughter must maintain appropriate behavior and language or your visit will be terminated.
- 13. Do not leave children under 18 years of age unattended.
- 14. There are special Holiday visits for Christmas, New Year's, 4th of July & Thanksgiving. All rules still apply.

Telephone calls:

Youth may call parents and guardians during the scheduled phone times during the evenings.

Unless it is an emergency you will not be able to make personal calls to your son/daughter or leave a message while they are in detention.

<u>Mail</u>:

Residents are able to write letters twice a week. Mail is delivered daily. Residents may receive mail daily. All letters must have senders name & address on the envelope.

Medical:

You will need to come to the detention center and fill out a "Consent to Medical Treatment" form. This will allow us to pass out "over the counter" and prescription medication to your child. If your son/daughter needs medical attention while in detention, we will notify you.

Medication:

We <u>do not</u> accept "over the counter medication". We provide Tylenol, cough syrup, etc.

If your son/daughter is taking prescribed medication, the medication $\underline{must \ be}$ in the **original** prescription bottle. If the dosage amount is *different* than what is on the prescription bottle, we need written instruction from the doctor.
