9 County Judge Joseph Wood called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

10 JP Sam Duncan led the prayer and pledge.

11  
12  
13 Members present were JP Lance Johnson, JP Shannon Marti, JP Sean Simons, JP Bill  
14 Ussery, JP Patrick Deakins, JP Lisa Ecke, JP Sam Duncan, JP Shawndra Washington,  
15 JP Eva Madison, JP Robert Dennis, JP Suki Highers, JP Evelyn Rios Stafford, JP Willie  
16 Leming, JP Jim Wilson, and JP Butch Pond.

17  
18 Judge Joseph Wood requested agenda items 9-11 be removed from the agenda per  
19 applicant. A motion to adopt the agenda as amended was made by JP Leming and  
20 seconded by JP Duncan. A voice vote was called and all members unanimously voted  
21 to adopt the agenda as amended.

22  
23 A motion to suspend the rules and read all resolutions and ordinances by title only was  
24 made by JP Leming and seconded by JP Duncan. A voice vote was called and all

27 During citizen's comments, Josh Moody, Richard Tiffany, and Madeline Porta spoke  
28 against expanding the jail. Julie Stenken spoke on using the CaresAct Fund money to  
29 purchase rapid tests for children in school. Alice Gachuzo-Colin spoke on a quote from  
30 Dr. Martin Luther King, "I ask you America to be true to what you put on paper".

252 Finance & Budget Committee met Tuesday, July 24, 2021. There were budget reviews  
253 on the Treasurer, Collector, County Clerk, Circuit Clerk, Circuit Court VII, and  
254 Prosecuting Attorney. The Finance & Budget Committee met Thursday, July 29, 2021.  
255 There were budget reviews on the Assessor, Circuit Judge I, Circuit Judge II, Circuit  
256 Judge IV, Circuit Judge V, Circuit Judge VI, and Public Defender. The Finance &  
257 Budget Committee met Tuesday, August 10, 2021. There were reports given on the  
258 Treasurer, Employees' Insurance, and Comptroller. There were budget reviews on the  
259 Election Commission, Circuit Court III, and Circuit Court VII. The Committee approved  
260 to include in the Budget Controls an increase of 10% to the County's salary ranges and  
261 give a 3.5% merit based raise. The Committee approved eight ordinances to be  
262 forwarded to the Quorum Court.

264 JP Lance Johnson presented the August Jails/Law Enforcement/Courts Committee  
265 Report. The Jails/Law Enforcement/Courts Committee met on Monday, August 9,  
266 2021. There were Statistic Reports given on the Juvenile Detention Center, Sheriff's  
267 Enforcement, and Detention. The Committee heard a presentation on the Strategic  
268 Covid Mitigation and Jail Bed Allocation. The Committee also received updates on the  
269 Community Alternative Program and from the Criminal Justice Coordinating  
270 Committee. The Committee approved three ordinances to be forwarded to the Finance  
271 & Budget Committee.  
272

273 JP Lisa Ecke presented the August Personnel Committee Report. The Personnel  
274 Committee met on Monday, August 9, 2021. JP Lisa Ecke presented the Chairman's  
275 Report to the Committee. The Committee heard a presentation from Compensation  
276 Consultant Blair Johanson on increasing the County's salary ranges and merit based  
277 raises. The Committee approved to forward the recommendation of Option A to  
278 increase the County's salary ranges by 10% and give a 3.5% merit based raise to the  
279 Finance & Budget Committee.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE 2016-68 AND SETTING THE SALARIES OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2016-68 changed the procedure by which the salaries of the Executive Branch of Washington County were fixed; and,

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court desires to pay all elected officials in the Executive Branch the maximum salaries allowed by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

ARTICLE 1. Ordinance 2016-68 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

ARTICLE 2. Beginning with the 2022 fiscal year, the annual salaries for the County Judge, Sheriff, Collector, Circuit Clerk, County Clerk, Assessor, Treasurer, and Coroner shall be one-hundred (100) percent of the maximum set by A.C.A. § 14-14-1204.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-14-1204, the Quorum Court is to fix by ordinance the annual salaries of the County Judge, Sheriff, Collector, Circuit Clerk, County Clerk, Assessor, Treasurer, and Coroner within the minimums and maximums set by the General Assembly; and,

The Planning Board/Zoning Board of Adjustments met on August 26, 2021 and approved the Springdale Public Schools Solar Facility Conditional Use Permit request.

Of the seven members, six were in attendance. All six voted in favor of the request.

**BACKGROUND/SYNOPSIS**

The applicant, Today's Power Inc (TPI), is requesting conditional use permit approval to operate a solar battery storage facility.

The zoning is for Agricultural and Single Family Residential uses with a maximum density of one (1) residential unit per acre.

The project parcel is in the City of Springdale Planning Area.

The proposal is located south of East Highway 412 and west of Sonora Middle School.

The project parcel is approximately 22.33 acres. Since the intended use is not agricultural or single family residential, the applicant must obtain a conditional use permit to allow its requested use.

The solar field will be fenced with gated. There will be parking available but limited to TPI personnel for maintenance purposes. TPI estimates around four (4) employees accessing the site for maintenance, but will typically not have personnel present 24 hours a day. Aside from TPI employees and its scheduled visitors, there will be no customers visiting the site.

The applicant intends to have a sign with the TPI logo and site details posted near the front gate. The solar field is expected to utilize the entire 16.5 acre parcel.

There should be no audible noise emitted from the facility and should not produce trash or waste after its construction phase. The solar structures will not exceed 10 feet in height.

The solar field facility will not have water or plumbing on site.

Staff sent notifications detailing the project to surrounding property owners and did not receive comments expressing opposition or agreement. Staff did receive an email from the public member asking details about the panels and whether or not they would reflect once installed. The applicant replied that the panels were designed to absorb, not reflect and that they haven't received complaints from nearby residences from their other solar facilities.

At the Planning Board meeting, there was no discussion from the Planning Board members or the public.

### **CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

The Planning Board/Zoning Board of Adjustments voted to approve the Springdale Public Schools Solar Facility CUP request with the following conditions:

#### **Utility Conditions**

The Planning Board/Zoning Board of Adjustments met on August 26, 2021 and approved the Beaver Lake Food Truck Court Conditional Use Permit request.

Of the seven members, six were in attendance. All six voted in favor of the request.

**BACKGROUND/SYNOPSIS**

The applicant is requesting conditional use permit approval to develop and operate food truck court business in an area that is zoned for Agricultural and Single Family Residential uses with a maximum density of one (1) residential unit per acre.

The zoning is for Agricultural and Single Family Residential uses with a maximum density of one (1) residential unit per acre.

The project parcel is not in a planning area.

The proposal is located along the south side of East Highway 412.

The project parcel is approximately 4.82 acres. The applicant intends to utilize approximately 0.60 acres for their project.

The applicant has already installed some infrastructure such as electric and water connects. Gravel has already been laid down on the site. These were installed before the applicant realized that the County has zoning. Further development and business has ceased as the applicant comes before the Planning Board and Quorum Court to gain conditional use permit approval.

A wastewater collection and storage system has already been installed and has been sized to meet the needs of ten food trucks. The gray water will flow to a 1,200 gallon tank for later disposal. Portable restroom are onsite for food truck employees and patrons. The applicant will contract with a licensed waste disposal company to collect both gray water and restroom waste per State regulations.

Soil work was not required with the project because the applicant did not intend to install septic or sewer because the sewage will be held in an underground storage tank for later disposal.

The applicant states there is enough parking on the southside of the gravel area for 27 vehicles.

Staff did sent notifications detailing the project to surrounding property owners and did not receive comments expressing opposition or agreement.

At the Planning Board meeting, a Planning Board member questioned the applicant's engineer about the van accessibility noted on the site plan. They wondered how the parking would be ADA compliant with gravel. The applicant stated they will concrete that area to be in compliance with the ADA.

Another Board member asked if the current driveway would be redesigned to suit ArDOT's specifications. The applicant stated that they're still processing through ArDOT but the driveway/entrance would be widened to allow two-way traffic and that they will concrete the driveway to the highway to be in compliance with ArDOT.

There were no other concerns or comments from the Planning Board members and the public comment period started.

One member of the public asked how far the proposed food truck court was to Beaver Lake. The applicant's engineer stated the distance between the lake's edge and the gravel area was approximately 179 feet. The member of the public then mentioned how oils would leak/drip from the food trucks and into the earth and then to the water. They stated the proposal was too close to the lake and that they found it concerning.

No other members of the public commented on the project.


