Purchasing Department Disposal of County Property

October, 2021

A.C.A. §14-16-106 provides for the disposal of surplus property owned by a county. If it is determined by the county judge and the county assessor that any personal property owned by a county is junk, scrap, discarded, or otherwise of no value to the county, then the property may be disposed of in any manner deemed appropriate by the county judge. The guidelines are described in the following 39 paragraphs: 40

The budget for each County department consists of appropriations of authorized expenditures in the following major categories:

Personal Services (Regular Salaries, Extra Help, Overtime & Fringe)

Supplies

• Other Services and Charges

Capital OutlayDebt Service

Inter-fund Transfers

Expenditures will be limited to the amounts appropriated in the above categories.

Transfers in Personal Services categories or transfers between departments may only be made by Ordinance.

Grant funds are not subject to the restrictions in this paragraph. Line item transfers within a departmental budget may be made within and into all categories, with the exception of the Personal Services Category as outlined herein. Transfers going into or out of the Capital Outlay Category shall not exceed \$20,000 per year in the General Fund, excluding the County Judge-Emergency Budget; any transfers exceeding this limit will require approval of the Quorum Court. No department may purchase supplies or other services and charges for another department except for utilities and cleaning and maintenance services provided by the Buildings & Grounds Department aggregated into the general budget. This does not apply to departments who work together in cost sharing projects.

Appropriations for use of grant funds must be made by ordinance with a grant agreement approved by the County Judge. All personnel positions funded by grants will be annotated as such and may be abolished upon expiration of the grant. All Grants will be administered through the County Grants Administration Office with all billings and financial reporting being handled in the Comptroller's Office.

All approved purchases must be made with a Purchase Order or P-Card and follow the written purchasing procedures as outlined by the County Judge.

The Comptroller will transfer monies monthly from individual departmental budgets into the Insurance Benefit Fund for all full time positions and qualifying part time employees regardless of whether all positions in the departments are filled.

Surplus personnel appropriations shall be de-appropriated from Full-time Salaries on a quarterly basis (April/July/October). These surplus funds shall be restored to unappropriated reserves.

The Washington County Job Evaluation Program is hereby amended by increasing all amounts by ten percent (10%) beginning January 1, 2022. Any employee that falls

below the amended minimum amount, shall receive a pay increase to the amended 87 minimum amount. 88 89 All employees, except those employees that are part of the Sheriff's Law 90 Enforcement Step Pay Plan, shall receive a minimum merit based pay increase of at least 91 3.5%. Any employee that receives a pay increase in excess of 3.5% due to the change 92 in the Washington County Job Evaluation Program shall not be eligible for the merit based 93 pay increase. WHEREAS, the Governor's Task Force to Advance the State of Law Enforcement in Arkansas recommended legislation that eases the state income tax burden on our active full-time law enforcement officers and recommended ensuring that entry level salaries for law enforcement officers be equivalent to or above the average annual wage in Arkansas; and,

WHEREAS, the average annual wage for full-time law enforcement officers in Arkansas ranks 49th in the nation and averages \$40,750 annually, below the average statewide wage in Arkansas of \$42,690; and the average entry level wage for law enforcement officers in Arkansas is \$28,610, barely above the yearly earnings of a minimum wage worker; and,

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers in the State of Arkansas risk their lives every day, working long hours for subpar wages, while Arkansas has one of the highest violent crime rates in the nation and ranks as the 4th most dangerous state in the nation; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor's Task Force to Advance the State of Law Enforcement in Arkansas identified the incredibly low salaries and limited agency funding to be the biggest barriers to law enforcement retention, recruitment, and hiring; and.

WHEREAS, the Governor's Task Force to Advance the State of Law Enforcement recommended a state income tax credit for full-time law enforcement officers in order to substantially promote retention, recruitment, hiring, a boost in morale, and greater economic security for full-time law enforcement officers and their families; and,

WHEREAS, the 93rd General Assembly of the State of Arkansas was duly presented legislation, SB 304 of 2021, during the 2021 regular session of the General Assembly which sought to establish a \$3,000 non-refundable state income tax credit to full-time law enforcement officers, however, SB 304 was not voted upon, passed or adopted into law; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas now has unprecedented record surpluses, and the Governor of the State of Arkansas has expressed an intent to call a special session of the General Assembly to consider and adopt numerous state income tax credits and rate reduction measures which in the aggregate in will totally hundreds of millions of dollars; and,

WHEREAS, the sponsors of SB304 have expressed an intent to file legislation seeking to establish a refundable state income tax credit for all full-time law enforcement officers in the sum of \$3,000 to be duly considered by the members of General Assembly of the State of Arkansas for their deliberation and to be adopted during the anticipated special session of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas.

The Planning Board/Zoning Board of Adjustments met on September 30, 2021 and approved the Moua 2021 Conditional Use Permit request.

Of the seven members, five were in attendance. All five voted in favor of the request.

BACKGROUND/SYNOPSIS

The applicant is requesting conditional use permit approval to utilize a tract of land for cultural and community events.

The zoning is for Agricultural and Single Family Residential uses with a maximum density of one (1) residential unit per acre.

The project parcel is not in a planning area.

The proposal is located along the east side of Hwy 59 and the south side of Hwy 244. The access drive is from Hwy 244.

The project parcel is approximately 40.37 acres.

Per Sec 11-202.1 Time Limits for Conditional Use Permittees (a), A Conditional Use Permittee that is not required to go through the land development approval process (Washington County Code sections 11-51 through 11-80), shall meet all conditions of the permit no later than eighteen (18) months from the date the Conditional Use Permit was granted. The Planning Director may grant up to two (2) ninety-day extensions; the denial of any such extension may be appealed to the Board. However, in no event shall more than two (2) extensions be granted.

This project was previously approved by the Planning Board on September 26, 2019 and ratified by the Quorum Court on October 17, 2019. The conditions of the CUP state that the applicant had 18 months to satisfy the conditions of the CUP. With the Pandemic occurring in 2020 and still occurring, the applicant was not able to satisfy all the conditions of the CUP before the April 2021 expiration date.

The applicant now seeks approval from the Planning Board and ratification by the Quorum Court to reactivate their CUP.

The following project explanation is from the 2019 Staff Report:

"In the past the Hmong Association has used this property a couple times per year for these events, and Washington County has issued Temporary CUPs. However, at this time, as Washington County no longer issues Temporary CUPs, and that the Hmong Association is proposing the construction of permanent structures, the General Conditional Use Permit is now required.

As the cultural and community events aren't considered a permanent change to the land use this CUP review isn't considering the events. Planning Staff is only reviewing the access road, gazebo, and restrooms for compliance with Washington County ordinances.

This CUP request is to allow the Hmong Association to continue using the property for these cultural and community events, and to ensure the restrooms are in compliance with the Arkansas Dept. of Health, and the permanent structures and private road are in compliance with the state fire code.

The request proposes approximately 15 acres of parking. But as the events are scheduled infrequently there will be no parking lot built; parking will be on the grass. Sight distance is adequate in all directions.

There are no existing structures on the property at this time."

There were no public comments or major concerns from the Planning Board members.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

The Planning Board/Zoning Board of Adjustments voted to approve the Moua 2021 CUP request with the following conditions:

Fire Conditions

- 1. "Fire Lane No Parking" signs are required to be placed along the private road, in accordance with Arkansas Fire Code.
- 2. The private access road shall be constructed such that it will support 75,000 lbs in all weather conditions.
- 3. The private access road shall be constructed to a width approved by the Fire Marshal, in accordance with Arkansas Fire Code. The Fire Marshal has stated the road shall be constructed to 12 ft wide.

The applicant's request is proposing ten (10) parking spaces, hours of operation from 6 am to 6 pm, Monday-Saturday with two (2) employees, with a driveway approximately 500 foot long.

A pull-through workshop building already exists on the property.

The zoning is for Agricultural and Single Family Residential uses with a maximum density of one (1) residential unit per acre.

The project parcel is inside Tontitown's planning area.

The subject property is located on the northern side of Harmon Rd, near the intersection at Arbor Acres Rd, WC-52.

There are no residential structures on the property at this time.

At the August 11, 2021 Special Planning Board meeting, six (6) members of the surrounding community spoke in opposition of the proposal. They voiced concerns about potential noise from the semi-trucks and air compressors, trucks and other vehicles are an eye-sore, the industrialization of their small quiet community, and just the general "I don't like it".

On an adjacent property to the north, a type of fabrication shop exists. It was discussed how the majority of the current "clutter" and "eye sore" was from this property and not the property to be utilized in the CUP.

Planning Board Member Philip Humbard made the motion to deny the CUP. Board Member Lisa Miller seconded. Board Members Joel Kelsey, Philip Humbard, Jay Pearcy, and Lisa Miller voted to deny the CUP. Board members Delbert Helm and Loren Shackelford voted in favor of the CUP.

The applicant has stated they will appeal the Planning Board's decision.

Our firm represents ER Mobile Service, LLC and its owner Elly Rivera (collectively "ER Mobile"), and on behalf of ER Mobile, we are hereby filing an appeal of an August 11, 2021 decision of the Washington County Zoning Board of Adjustments. This appeal is being filed within thirty days of the Board's decision as required by Washington County Ordinance 2009-33 amending Section 11-206.

On August 11, 2021, the Washington County Zoning Board of Adjustments denied ER Mobile's application for a Conditional Use Permit ("CUP"). The CUP was for a commercial use, located in Section 15, Township 17, Range 31 West, in Washington County, Arkansas.

From our understanding, the Board denied the applicant's CUP due to the Board's finding that 1) the proposed use would not be compatible with the surrounding area and/or because 2) the conditional use would be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the surrounding area.
