RE: Rock Town Layover RV Park CUP - Rick and Troyce England

Dear Quorum Court:

It is our understanding that the decision of the Washington County Planning Board on August 11, 2021 to deny the Conditional Use Permit was based upon concerns of the surrounding properties owners. We are filing this appeal to address those concerns and to persuade the Quorum Court that a Conditional Use Permit is appropriate and should be granted. We will briefly address the concerns of the surrounding property owners below.

The proposed project is a six camping spot RV Park which is located and designed for use of the nearby public land trail system designed for ATV/side-by-side (hereinafter ATV) use. It is legal to drive an ATV on the roads from the proposed Park to the trail system.

The surrounding property owners expressed concerns about noise generated by ATVs that will be in the Park and traveling from the Park to the trail system. The surrounding property owners expressed concerns that the noise caused by the ATVs, trash left by riders, etc. would be inconsistent with the current use of the property in the area. However, the surrounding property owners all stated that the issues of noise and other nuisances already existed from the existing trail system and the ATVs that use it. The property owners complained about problems that are already in existence in this area. The addition of an ATV RV Park is very consistent with the existing use of property in the area, as made clear by the statements made by the surrounding property owners.

Some of the surrounding property owners expressed concerns of an increase in traffic on Crawley Road. However, the RV park will only contain six spots; a very limited number of vehicles. Further, the nature of an RV is to park it, and leave it in the same parking spot for several days, thus reducing the normal traffic one would expect from six vehicles. The distance that the RVs would have to travel down Crawley Road is approximately 100 feet (turning off Bug Scuffle Rd). This is a very minimal amount of distance to travel down the road for a concern over excessive traffic. There was also concerns about traffic from trucks and ATVs on

the road, but again, these concerns are already in existence from the trail system, as was expressed by the surrounding property owners.

A concern about noise and light pollution emanating from the Park was expressed. The proposed Park is on a 40 acre square tract of land. The site of the proposed campsites is as near to Crawley Road as is reasonably possible. This leaves a large, wooded buffer zone between the surrounding property owners and the Park; in addition to the distance of the homes from the edge of the 40 acres of the proposed Park. It is unlikely that noise and light pollution from the Park is gong to reach the surrounding property owners. And, again, the surrounding property owners expressed that there was noise and light from the ATVs already in legal use; further showing that this proposed Park is consistent with the general use of property in the area. Additionally, the Park owners are willing to build a fence to further alleviate these concerns.

A few of the surrounding property owners expressed a concern that the campers at the Park would be in danger from gunshots during hunting season, as they and their families hunt on the surrounding land. First, it should be noted that if a person's property (the bullet) travels onto another person's land, that is trespassing. The hunter or shooter is responsible to prevent bullets traveling onto or over someone else's property for safety reasons. Clearly, it is unreasonable to expect a property owner to protect themselves from bullets coming from a neighboring property.

Additionally, in regard to the hunting safety concerns, it is a basic hunting safety practice to always be aware of what is beyond your target in case you miss the target or the bullet travels through the target. This is even a question on the Hunter's Safety Card Exam. Hunting safely is the responsibility of the hunter, not the adjacent property owner.

The same argument regarding hunting safety could be made about all the existing, surrounding structures, and not just the proposed Park. If the other homes are safe, why would the Park be any different?

Finally, in regards to hunting safety, the property in question is a wooded, 40 acre tract, with the camping spots located as near to the road as possible. Creating a large buffer zone between the property being hunted on and the Park. The owners of the proposed Park have done everything reasonably possible to make the their campers safe from hunters, even though that is not their responsibility.

A concern that an RV Park for ATVs would create additional crime and excessive alcohol consumption (presumably, leading to more crime and disturbances). The surrounding property owners failed to show how or why a person using an RV Park is more likely to commit crime or consume alcohol in excess. Really, this is a concern about more people in the area. And, again, this concern was expressed about the existing, legal use of ATVs in the area, which would not change by allowing the RV Park. At most, it would add six small groups or families to the area on a temporary basis. There is no reason to believe these six families are more likely to commit crime or excessively consume alcohol than any other six families.

At least one surrounding property owner expressed a concern about how the sewage was to be collected and disposed of. Initially, the plan was to allow the RVs to use a near by RV Park to

dump their wastewater. However, due to these concerns, the owners of the proposed RV Park are willing to make changes to this plan. Specifically, the use of a Caddie system could/would be used if required in the CUP. A Caddie system allows the RV to dispose of the waste into a transportable container and that container is then transported and the wastewater disposed of properly at a different site.

Additionally, if the Quorum Court prefers, the owners of the proposed RV Park are also willing to install a septic system for the RVs to empty their wastewater into. Said septic system would meet the requirements recommended by a licensed septic system company or those requirements laid out by the Quorum Court.

There was a concern that people would be living in the RVs permanently in the Park. Park rules would prohibit this and limited the maximum stay to 10 days (except for a possible Park Manager or Owner who is responsible for maintaining the Park or enforcing Park rules).

Finally, there were some general concerns about nuisances, such as noise, lights, trash, alcohol consumption, use of ATVs at night, etc. All of these concerns are addressed by the natural buffer zone between the campsites and the surrounding property, the rules and regulations to be enforced in the park (quiet hours, trash collection, etc.), and efforts by the owners to maintain a clean and pleasant RV Park.

In conclusion, the owners of the proposed RV Park have heard the concerns of the neighbors and have made every reasonable effort to assuage those concerns. The statements made by surrounding property owners confirmed that the existing use of land in the area was consistent with the proposed Park. The ATVs, trails, and people using the trails are already in the area. There is no convincing evidence that six RV parking spots are going to substantially increase the existing ATV use in the area.

WHEREAS, the County desires to establish guidelines for the appropriation of monies from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund ("ARPA") received from the U.S. Treasury in 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the County desires to prioritize the expenditure of ARPA funds by allocating as much of those funds as needed for the sole purpose of supporting all County related expenditures and all relevant public water and sewer requests; and,

WHEREAS, any remaining ARPA funds, subject to the existing County, State, and Federal eligibility requirements, would be available to support funding requests by all other non-governmental organizations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

ARTICLE 1. ARPA funds shall be used primarily for supporting County related expenditures, as allowed by the federal guidelines. Any unused funds may be used to support non-county related expenditures, as allowed by the federal guidelines.

ARTICLE 2. All non-governmental organizations that receive funds under this Ordinance shall be deemed eligible, in accord with federal guidance, by a third party. Said third party shall be selected by the County Judge and shall create a process for applicants in collaboration with the County Judge's office.
