#### MEETING March 23, 2022 MINUTES

A meeting of the Fourth Judicial District Drug Task Force Control Board was held on March 23, 2022.

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Tim Helder. Upon roll call, the above listed members were acknowledged present. Copies of the minutes from the January 26, 2022 meeting were distributed to all present. A motion was made by Frank Gamble, and seconded by Jamie Fields, to approve the minutes. The motion was approved unanimously.

A copy of the financial report for the Grant FY2021-2022 was distributed to all present for review, period ending January 31, 2022. Tonyia Tannehill stated the total expense to date was \$310,685.00 which included State Drug Crime Fund \$91,319.00, Local Drug Crime Fund \$18,264.00, and Non-Allowed-\$201,102.00.

A copy of the financial report for the Grant FY2021-2022 was distributed to all present for review, period ending February 28, 2022. Tonyia Tannehill stated the total expense to date was \$333,291.00 which included State Drug Crime Fund \$91,319.00, Local Drug Crime Fund \$18,264.00, and Non-Allowed- \$223,708.00.

Sergeant Tyler Moore reported on the task force's activity January 1, 2022 through January 31, 2022 and distributed a copy of statistics to all present. Moore stated that in January the task force opened 34 cases, closed 21 cases, and made 16 arrests. Moore further noted that \$8,410.00 was expended for the purchase of evidence, \$0.00 for the purchase of service, and \$1,088.00 for the purchase of information. Moore stated that drugs seized during the month included: Methamphetamine, Marijuana, Heroin, Cocaine, Ecstasy, and pharmaceuticals. Moore stated that 3 warrants were served. Also noted, 12 drug convictions for the month of

January. The task force seized 0 vehicles and a total of \$11,350.00 in U.S. Currency during the month. The locations of DTF Enforcement Action for the month were: Fayetteville 11 cases, Springdale 12 cases, Madison County 1 case, Tontitown 1 case, West Fork 8 cases, and Farmington 1 case.

Sergeant Tyler Moore reported on the task force's activity February 1, 2022 through February 28, 2022 and distributed a copy of statistics to all present. Moore stated that in February the task force opened 25 cases, closed 28 cases, and made 8 arrests. Moore further noted that \$420.00 was expended for the purchase of evidence, \$0.00 for the purchase of service, and \$920.00 for the purchase of information. Moore stated that drugs seized during the month included: Methamphetamine, Marijuana, Heroin, Cocaine, LSD, Psilocybin Mushrooms, and pharmaceuticals. Moore stated that 6 warrants were served. Also noted, 12 drug convictions for the month of February. The task force seized 0 vehicles and a total of \$14,937.00 in U.S. Currency during the month. The locations of DTF Enforcement Action for the month were: Fayetteville 6 cases, Springdale 10 cases, Madison County 1 case, Tontitown 1 case, West Fork 8 cases, and Farmington 1 case.

The Drug Task Force continues to see an increase in Fentanyl cases. Detectives have also been assisting on overdose cases involving Fentanyl.

#### Sergeant Tyler Moore reported on the following dispositions.

**DTF-18-162 (State of Arkansas v Linsie Anderson)** was a DTF arrest resulting in the seizure of a Lexus passenger car valued at \$5,550.00 on April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018. \$1,110.00 went to the Arkansas State Drug Director's Office and \$1,665.00 went to the Washington County Prosecutor's Office. It was recommended that 15% of the net total of \$2,775.00 go to the Drug Task Force and the remaining balance be split based on current staffing (Springdale 50%, Fayetteville 25%, WCSO 12.5%, Rural 12.5%).

#### Notes:

On April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018, detectives received information that Anderson was staying in a local motel and in possession of methamphetamine. Detectives observed Anderson leave the hotel and made contact. Anderson was in the Lexus and in possession of 4 baggies of methamphetamine weighing approximately 86g.

A motion was made by Jamie Fields, second by Frank Gamble to approve this recommendation. This motion was approved unanimously.

**DTF-21-095 (State of Arkansas v Darryl Green)** was a DTF arrest resulting in the seizure of \$19,502.00 on October 1, 2021. \$5,850.60 went to the Washington County Prosecutor's Office. It was recommended that 15% of the net total of \$13,651.40 go to the Drug Task Force and the remaining balance be split based on current staffing (Springdale 42.85%, Fayetteville 28.57%, WCSO 14.29%, Rural 14.29%).

#### Notes:

On October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 detectives executed simultaneous search warrants on targets of a Springdale Drug Trafficking Organization after making numerous controlled buys. Detectives waited for Green to exit his apartment and placed him under arrest. Green had meth, crack cocaine, powder cocaine, marijuana, oxycodone, a firearm, and the currency in his possession.

A motion was made by Frank Gamble, second by Jamie Fields to approve this recommendation. This motion was approved unanimously.

**DTF-21-229 (State of Arkansas v Torrie Broadway)** was a DTF arrest resulting in the seizure of \$2,322.00 on September 7, 2021. \$464.40 went to the Arkansas State Drug Director's Office and \$696.60 went to the Washington County Prosecutor's Office. It is recommended that 15% of the net total of \$1,161.00 go to the Drug Task Force and the remaining balance be split based on current staffing (Springdale 42.85%, Fayetteville 28.57%, WCSO 14.29%, Rural 14.29%).

#### Notes:

On September 7, 2021 detectives responded to a shooting investigation in Fayetteville. Detectives conducted a search of the suspects residence and located a pistol, Xanax pills, marijuana, and \$2,322.00 US currency.

A motion was made by Frank Gamble, second by Jamie Fields to approve this recommendation. This motion was approved unanimously.

**DTF-21-163 (State of Arkansas v David Simms)** was a DTF arrest resulting in the seizure of \$15,237.00 on July 9, 2021. \$3,047.40 went to the Arkansas State Drug Director's Office and \$4,571.10 went to the Washington County Prosecutor's Office. It was recommended that 15% of the net total of \$7,618.50 go to the Drug Task Force and the remaining balance be split based on current staffing (Springdale 42.85%, Fayetteville 28.57%, WCSO 14.29%, Rural 14.29%).

#### Notes:

On July 9, 2021, detectives executed multiple search warrants on a Fayetteville Drug Trafficking Organization. Detectives attempted to arrest Simms and he fled from FPD officers and was caught in short order. Simms was in possession of the currency, co-mingled with DTF buy funds, two pistols, and methamphetamine.

A motion was made by Jamie Fields, second by Frank Gamble to approve this recommendation. This motion was approved unanimously.

**DTF-21-249 (State of Arkansas v Rigoberto DeLeon)** was a DTF arrest resulting in the seizure of \$1,198.00 on September 22, 2021. \$140.00 went to the Arkansas State Drug Director's Office and \$359.40 went to the Washington County Prosecutor's Office. It was recommended that 15% of the net total of \$698.60 go to the Drug Task Force and the remaining balance be split based on current staffing (Springdale 42.85%, Fayetteville 28.57%, WCSO 14.29%, Rural 14.29%).

#### Notes:

On September 12, 2021, detectives conducted a traffic stop on Rigoberto DeLeon in Springdale during a drug investigation. DeLeon was in possession of the currency, co-mingled with DTF buy funds. Follow up search warrants on DeLeon's storage units led detectives to the seizure of multiple pounds of heroin, fentanyl, methamphetamine, and 1000's of fentanyl pills.

A motion was made by Jamie Fields, second by Frank Gamble to approve this recommendation. This motion was approved unanimously.

**DTF 21-164 (State of Arkansas v Cardrick Saxton)** was a DTF arrest resulting in the seizure of \$2,352.00 on July 26, 2021. \$470.40 went to the Arkansas State Drug Director's Office and \$705.60 went to the Washington County Prosecutor's Office. It was recommended that 15% of the net total of \$1,176.00 go to the Drug Task Force and the remaining balance be split based on current staffing (Springdale 42.85%, Fayetteville 28.57%, WCSO 14.29%, Rural 14.29%).

#### Notes:

During the month of July 2021, detectives conducted multiple controlled buys of oxycodone pills from Saxton. On July 26<sup>th</sup>, detectives observed Saxton conduct a drug transaction in a parking lot. Detectives conducted a traffic stop on Saxton and located numerous pills and the currency, which was co-mingled with DTF buy funds.

A motion was made by Jamie Fields, second by Frank Gamble to approve this recommendation. This motion was approved unanimously.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

Kirk Lane discussed an upcoming grant for \$250,000.00, which will be available to law enforcements in fall of 2022. This grant is geared towards developing a Peer Recovery Specialist and a police investigator team to respond to overdosed. Currently have six projects going. Would like to see six more teams developed.
