Clarification

- 1. Do you wish to retain any of the current medical staff?
 - a. Yes, if possible.

 - a. The Current medical provider is an independent contractor and pays their employees directly. The sheriff's office does not know how much their employees are paid.
- 3. How many officers currently work at the facility?
 - a. There are approximately 320 employee positions at the sheriff's office.
- 4. Is the health services provider responsible for the cost of all drug screenings for employees at the facility?
 - a. Currently the county purchases the drug screening kits.

 - a. Current matrix is: One, APRN 40 hours a week, one mental health professional 40 hours a week One LPN 40 hours a week Two paramedics or RN's on days 12 hours a day seven days a week and 1 paramedic or RN on nights 12 hours seven days a week three med passers or MA's AM and PM to pass meds for approximately two hours each med pass. one MA generally a med passer for 12 hours seven days week nights and days for intake medical question and COVID screening and the doctor is onsite 20 hours a week and available by phone 20 hours. - 70. The timeline established from the RFP only allows for 2 business days to accommodate a full transition from the time the proposals are opened to the start of the contract. This will not allow for an adequate review by the Washington County budget committee or the quorum court, nor will it allow for the new County Judge to review and sign the contract before it officially begins. Further, no professional company in the correctional industry can perform a transition in the limited established time frame established by the RFP. This will likely result in most, if not all, of the companies in industry to pass on submitting a proposal in response to this RFP. Ultimately, this would leave the incumbent as the only option for the inmate medical contract for Washington County in 2023. It is very possible this may cause the taxpayers to pay more than required for this critical service and possibly with a less comprehensive program than desired. If the incumbent is confident in the current program and the probability of retaining the contract long term, it should not be an issue for them to extend their contract at least a month to allow Washington County to provide due diligence on this rather large budgetary item that impacts every taxpayer in the County. Considering these concerns, would Washington County consider extending the start date of the new contract to at least 2 weeks after the contract is awarded?



- a. The current Medical Contract expires on the midnight of the 31st. The current provider's insurance will expire at the end of year and cannot assist us any longer. Washington County has an obligation to the detainees and cannot go 2 weeks without a Provider
