BACKGROUND/SYNOPSIS

The applicant is requesting to build a venue that will be situated on approximately 40 acres located at 17996 Bethlehem Road, Winslow. Existing structures will be demolished, and a ~10,000 sqft event venue to be constructed for weddings and professional events utilizing only seven (7) acres. Maximum capacity will be 300 persons. At a 3:1 ratio for cars-to-guests, plus 25% for overflow parking, will be approximately 125 parking spaces provided with no less than four (4) regular handicapped parking spaces and one (1) accessible van space.

The zoning is for Agricultural and Single Family Residential uses with a maximum density of one (1) residential unit per acre.
