ORDINANCE NO. 2016-

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2016-22 IN REGARD TO DANGEROUS, POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS, AND HAZARDOUS ANIMALS.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2016-22 was adopted on April 21, 2016, amending Washington County Code Chapter 2.7 in regard to dangerous, potentially dangerous, and hazardous animals; and,

WHEREAS, said ordinance removed the definitions covering livestock and poultry; and,

WHEREAS, the Sheriff has asked that this be placed back into the ordinance as they respond to animal complaints weekly pertaining to livestock and poultry.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, STATE OF ARKANSAS:

ARTICLE 1. Definitions for potentially dangerous and dangerous animals in Washington County Ordinance No. 2016-22 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2.7-21. – Definitions.

Potentially dangerous animal: An animal, regardless of breed, that when unprovoked:

- (a) inflicts bites on a person, <u>livestock</u>, <u>poultry</u>, or a domestic animal either on public or private property; or,
- (b) chases or approaches a person upon the streets, sidewalks, any public grounds, or otherwise off the owner's property in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack, or any animal with a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury, or otherwise to threaten the safety of persons or domestic animals, <u>livestock</u>, or <u>poultry</u>.

Dangerous animal: An animal, regardless of breed, that

- (a) inflicts, either directly or through an unbroken chain of causal events, serious injury on a person without provocation on public or private property;
- (b) kills a domestic animal, <u>livestock</u>, <u>or poultry</u> without provocation while the animal is off the owner's property; or,
- (c) has been previously found to be potentially dangerous because of injury inflicted on a person, the owner having received notice of such and the animal again aggressively bites, attacks, or endangers the safety of persons.

An animal is not potentially dangerous or dangerous if the threat, injury, or damage was sustained by a person who, at the time, was committing a willful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the animal owner, or was tormenting, abusing, or assaulting the animal or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused, or assaulted the animal or was committing or attempting to commit a crime. Livestock is exempt from the definitions of hazardous, dangerous or potentially dangerous.

ARTICLE 2. <u>Emergency Clause</u>: It is hereby determined that it is the public's best interest for this ordinance to be effective immediately; and the general health, safety and welfare of the citizens are affected by such for the reasons as set out above; therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be and is effective from the date of its passage.
