RESOLUTION NO. 2016-_____

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUORUM COURT
OF THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON,
STATE OF ARKANSAS, A RESOLUTION
TO BE ENTITLED:**

**A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE STATE
OF ARKANSAS TO FULLY FUND THE
COSTS OF HOUSING AND CARING FOR
STATE PRISONERS IN COUNTY JAILS
WITHOUT TAKING SAID FUNDING FROM
OTHER RESOURCES DUE TO COUNTIES.**

WHEREAS, County Jails across Arkansas in general and the Washington County Detention Center in particular, hold thousands of detainees every year who are rightfully classified as State prisoners; and,

WHEREAS, these State prisoners are convicted of felonies, arrested on probation or parole violations, or are otherwise awaiting transport to State correctional facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the State currently reimburses counties at the rate of \$30 per day per prisoner; and,

WHEREAS, the actual cost of incarcerating a prisoner in the Washington County Detention Center is almost \$67 per day, resulting in the County subsidizing more than half of the cost of housing and feeding State prisoners; and,

WHEREAS, there are currently 146 State prisoners in the Washington County Detention Center out of a total population of 597 detainees; and,

WHEREAS, the combination of large numbers of State prisoners in County Jails and the lack of State funding to compensate for these prisoners puts an enormous and unjustified burden on County financial resources.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUORUM
COURT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS:**

ARTICLE 1: The Washington County Quorum Court respectfully requests that the Arkansas General Assembly pass an Act fully funding the actual costs to counties of housing State prisoners, and further respectfully requests that the Governor sign the same into law.

ARTICLE 2: The Washington County Quorum Court respectfully requests that the Arkansas General Assembly refrain from taking said funds from County turnback funds.
